THE NON-LABOR DAY PICNIC

Activities will include dedication of the new park by city officials, live music by THE FINISH LINE, a local band featuring Rebecca DeShields who lives on Irwin Street, Kid games galore, and a cookie-baking contest. THE NEW PARK

Most of you have seen the steel and concrete realization of architect Gary Semling's (Irwin Street) plan for the park. Gary and a group too large to mention have pushed the plans through the City, arranged for the contractor and built the park the way they wanted it. Many thanks and congratulations for a job well done to all of you who made this happen. It's been a long and sometimes frustrating effort

But, have you looked at the details around the entry? The tiles and the engraved bricks are totally home grown.

The tiles were done by local children under the supervision of Molly Blauvelt and Patti McKay. They were set by Sarah Leipsic, Catherine Wilson, Becky DeShields, Jennifer Mennucci and Steve Thies. The engraved bricks have been on sale for the last year and are still available if you want to add your name to the ones already there. Call Sheryl Draper (456-0199) to make the arrangements.

The bricks are a fundraising effort to support completion of the park and sell for \$125 each. A whole flock of local people spent most of a weekend laying the bricks on a specially prepared bed of sand. Thanks folks, we appreciate your contributions to the park and to the 'hood.

One last note on the park: what's done is phase one. Phase two, the landscaping is still being discussed. Rob Spiess is negotiating with the developer of Baywood Terrace on the hill for him to make a contribution to the landscaping efforts. Stay tuned.
